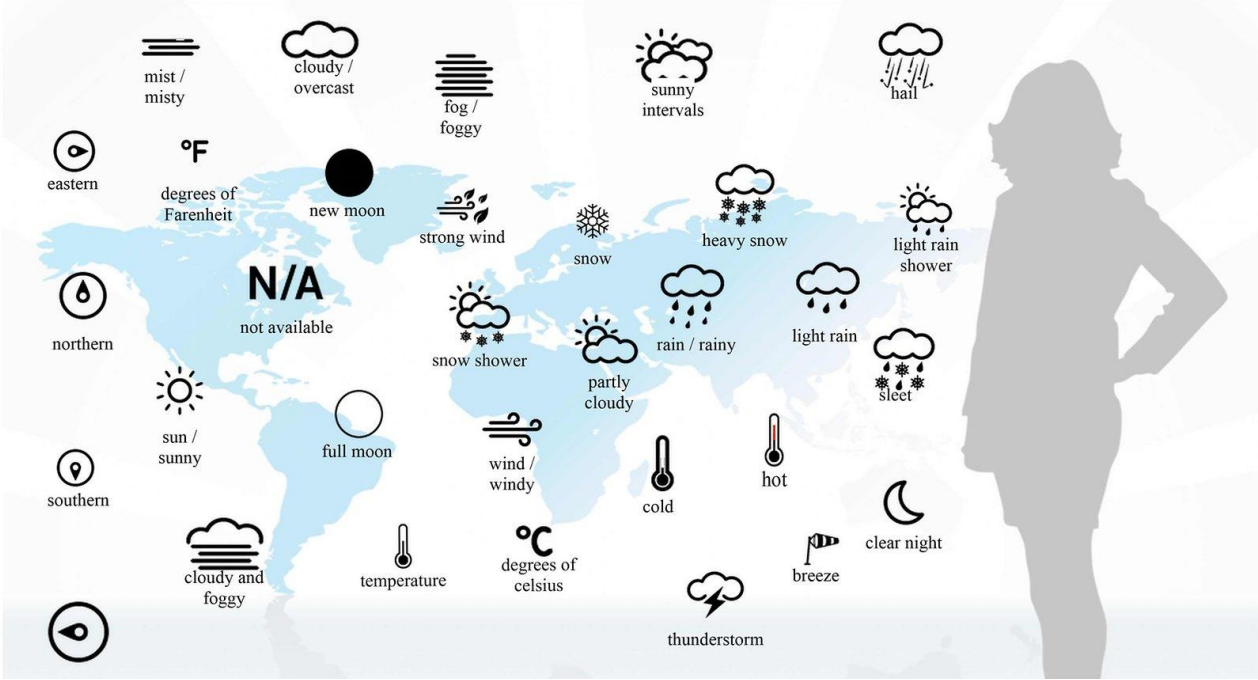

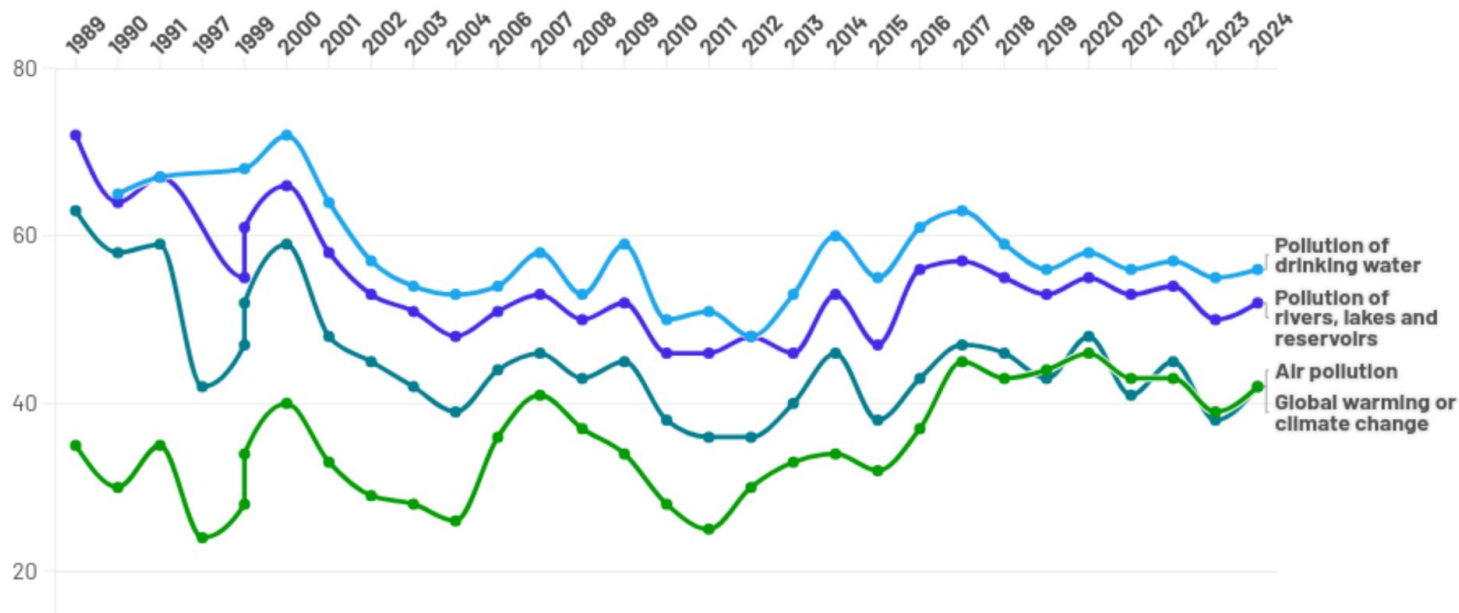

- Working with nature



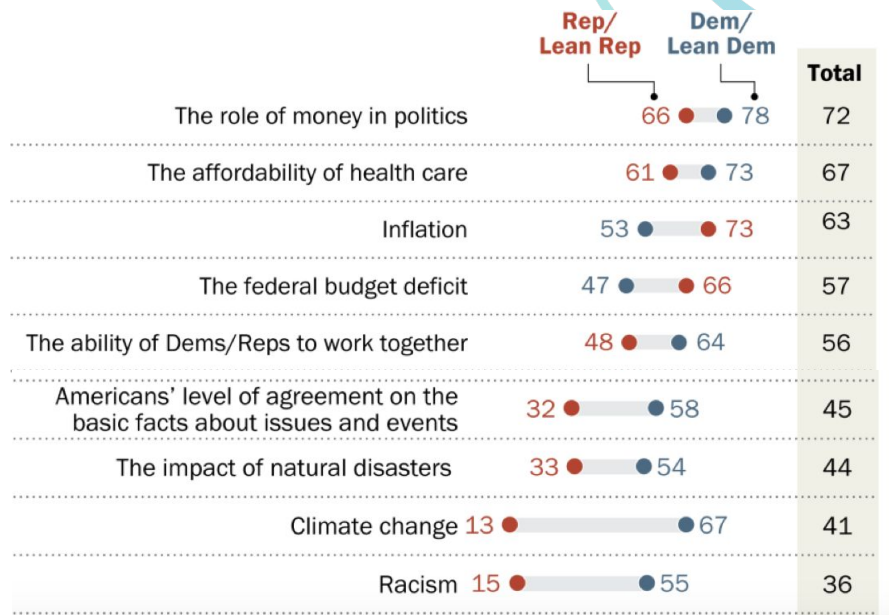
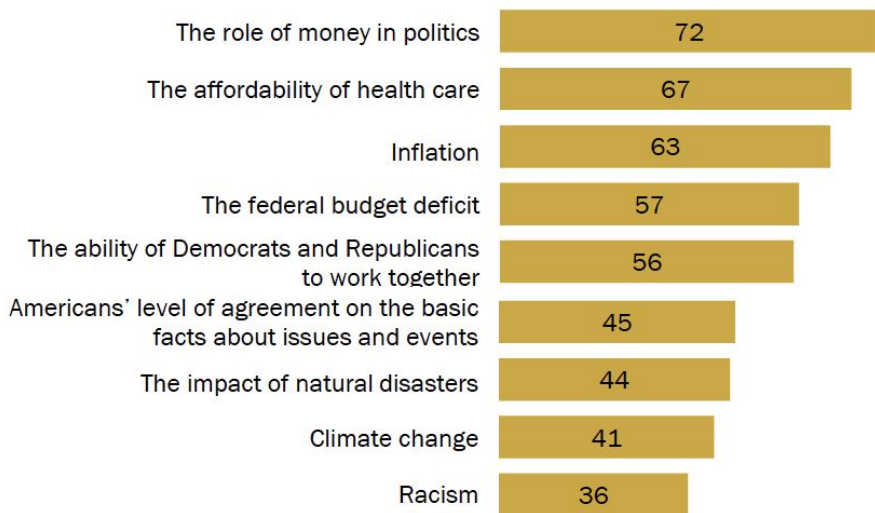
# Big picture water views

- Don't buy that we have to choose between the economy and environment

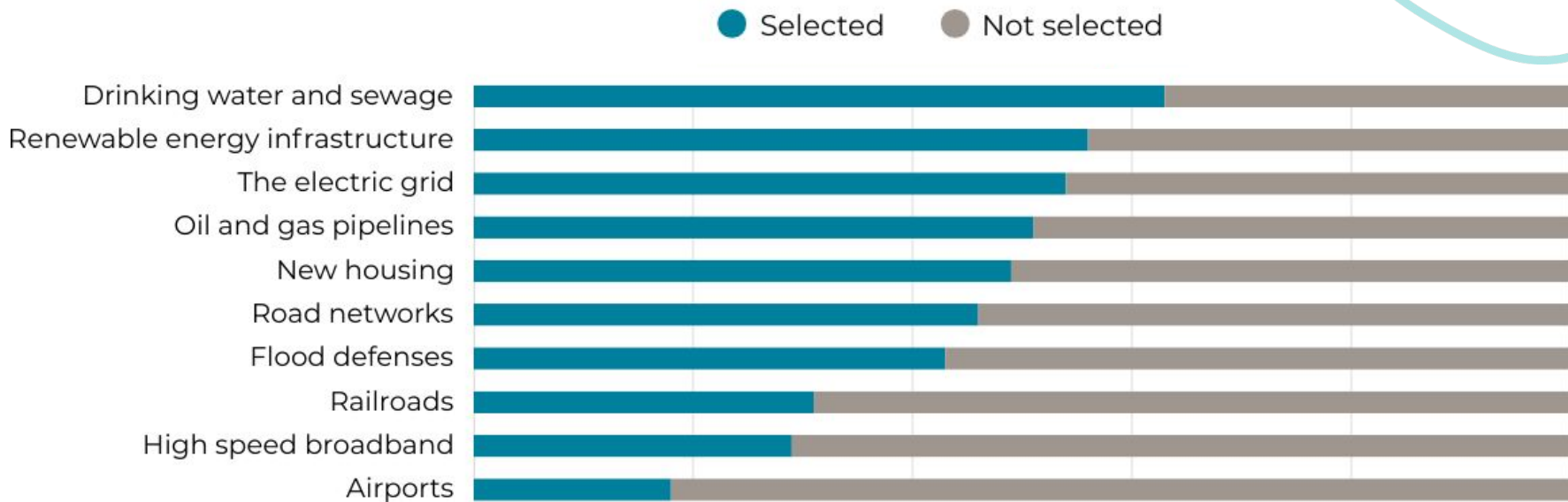

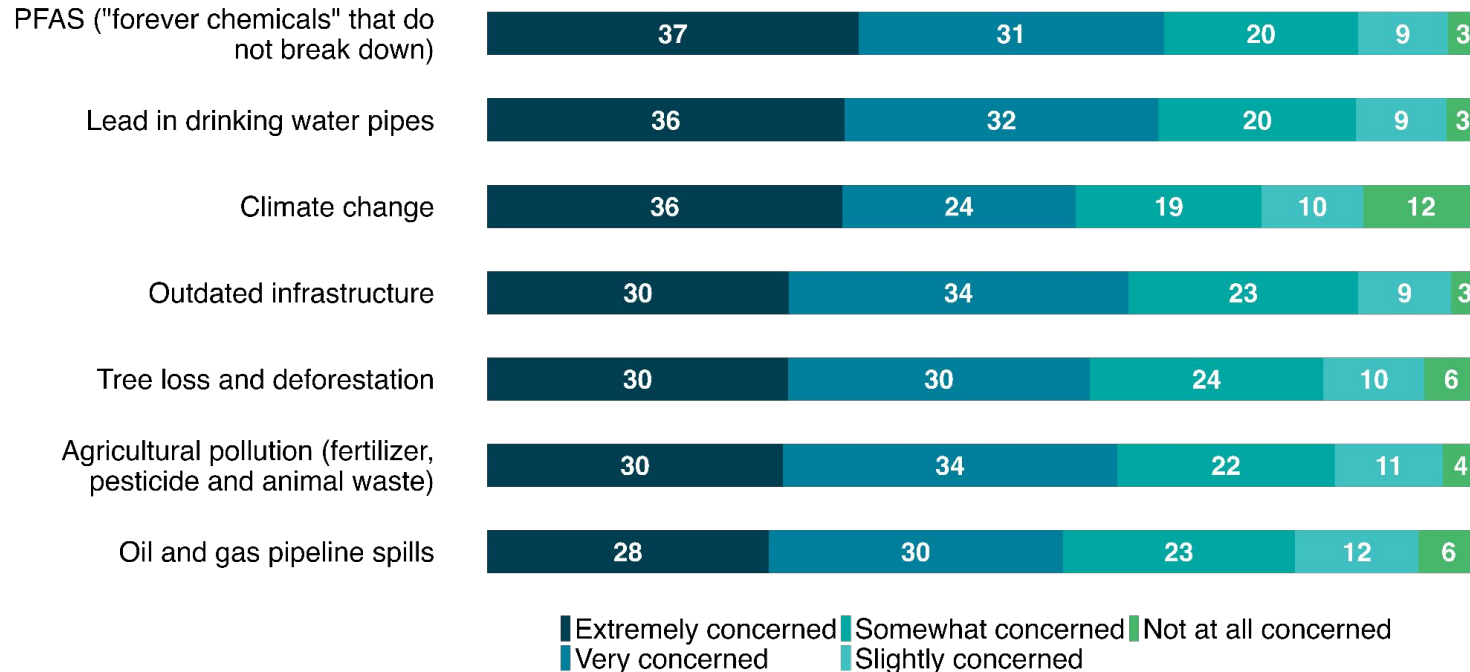

How concerned are you, if at all, that the following issues threaten the safety of drinking water in the United States?



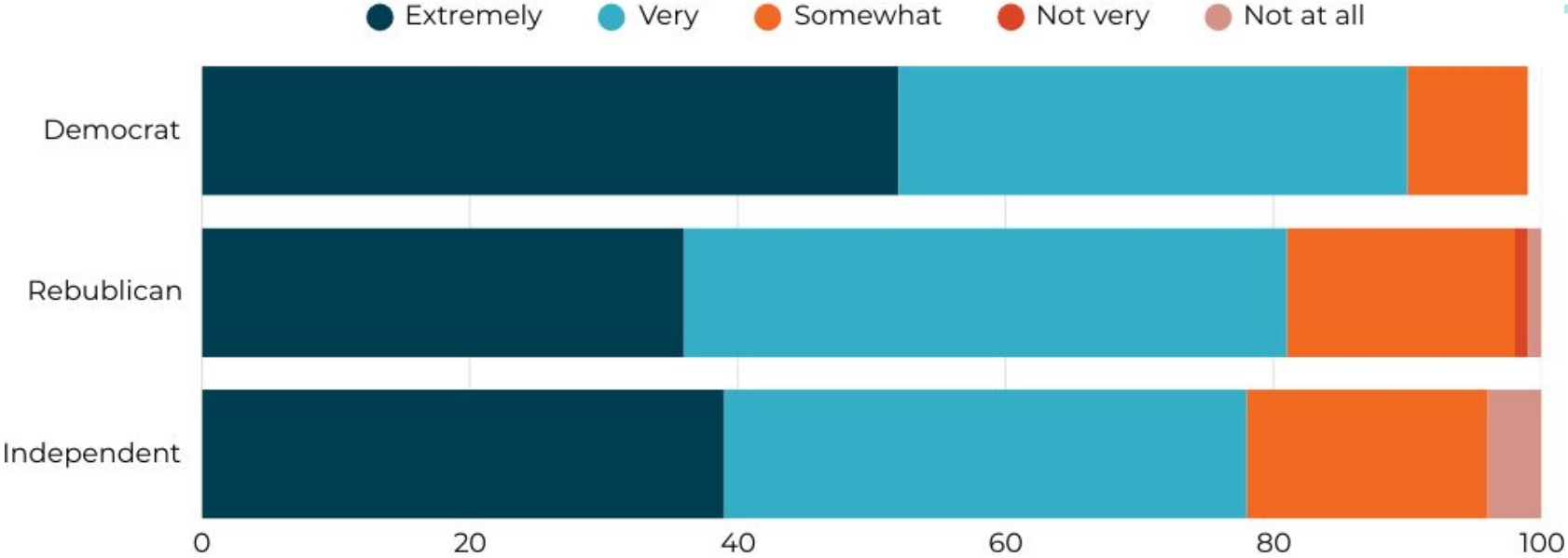

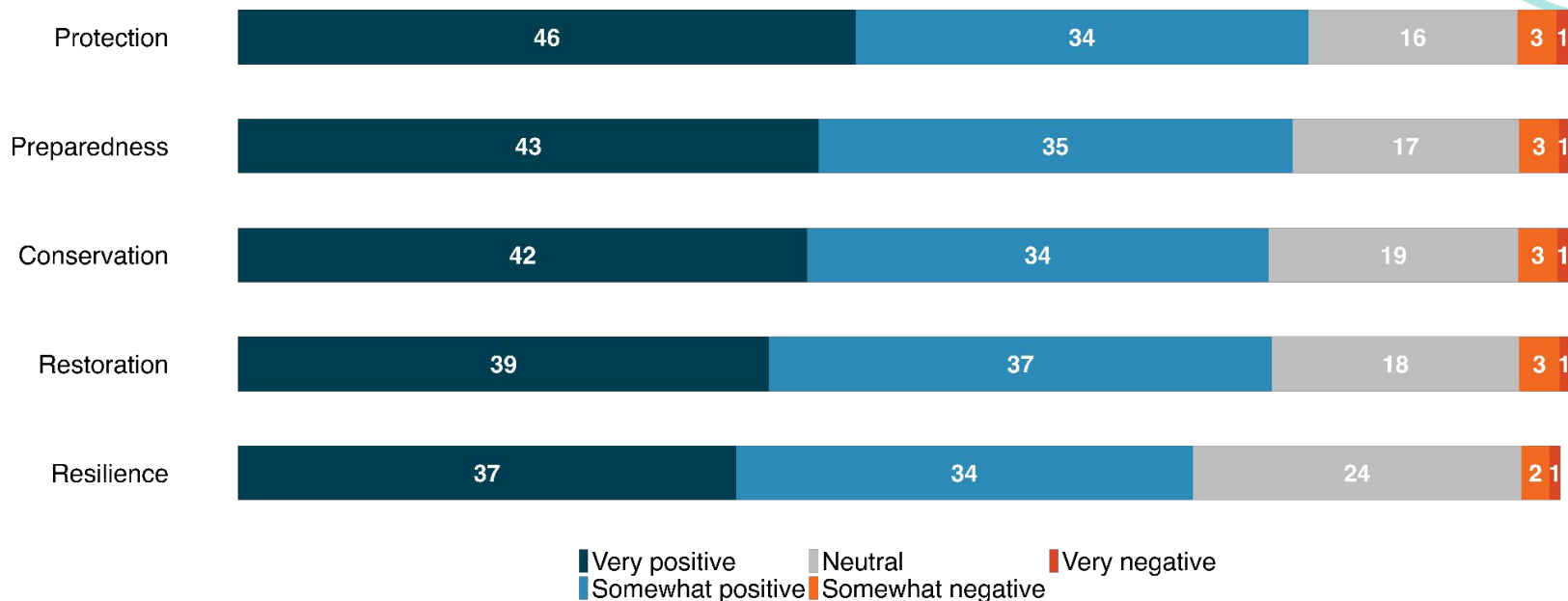

How important is it for communities to invest in disaster resilience?



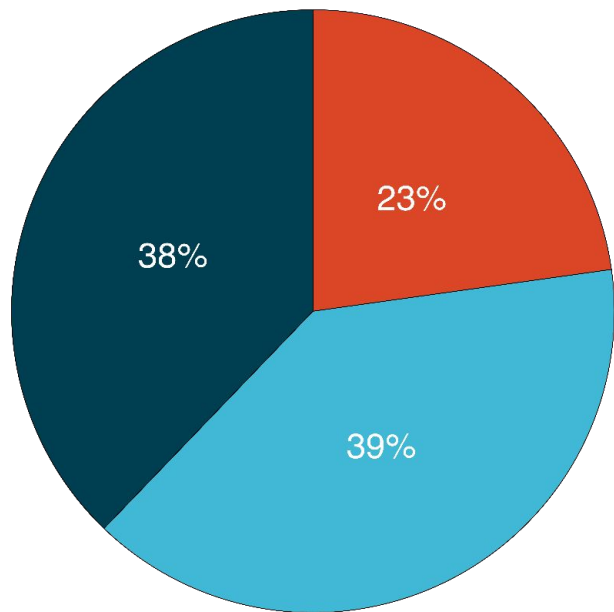

Please rate how you feel about each of the following terms:



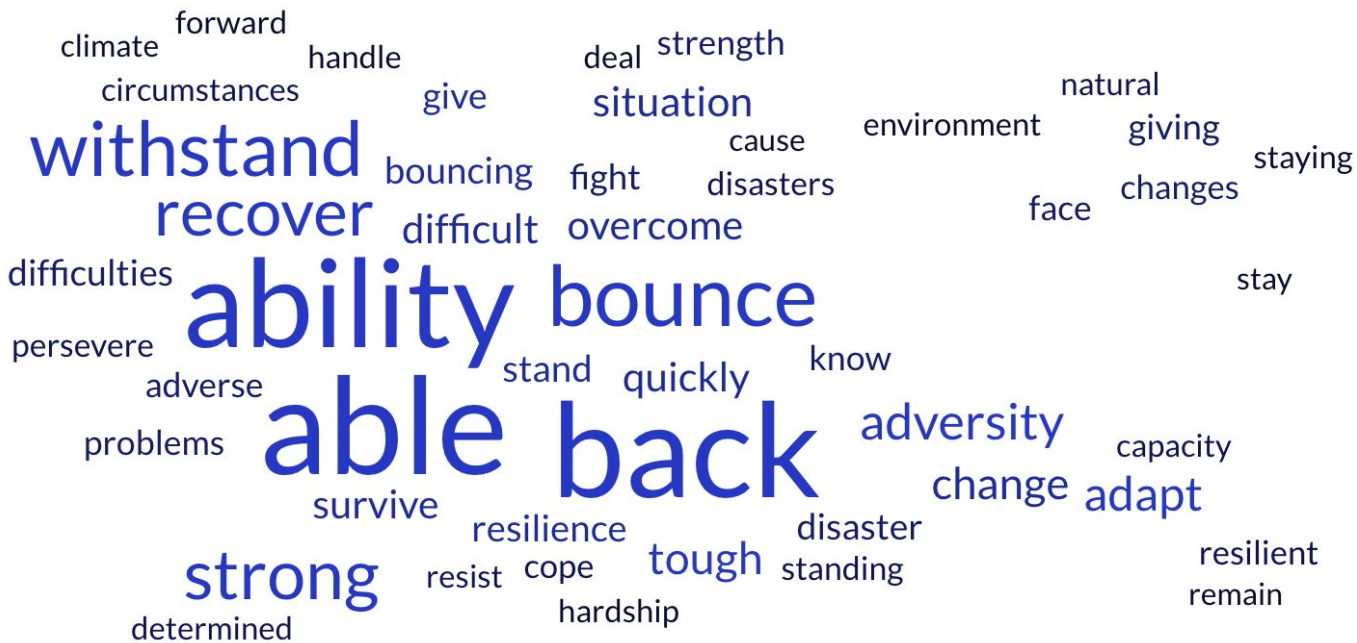

Which description best matches what “resilience” means to you?

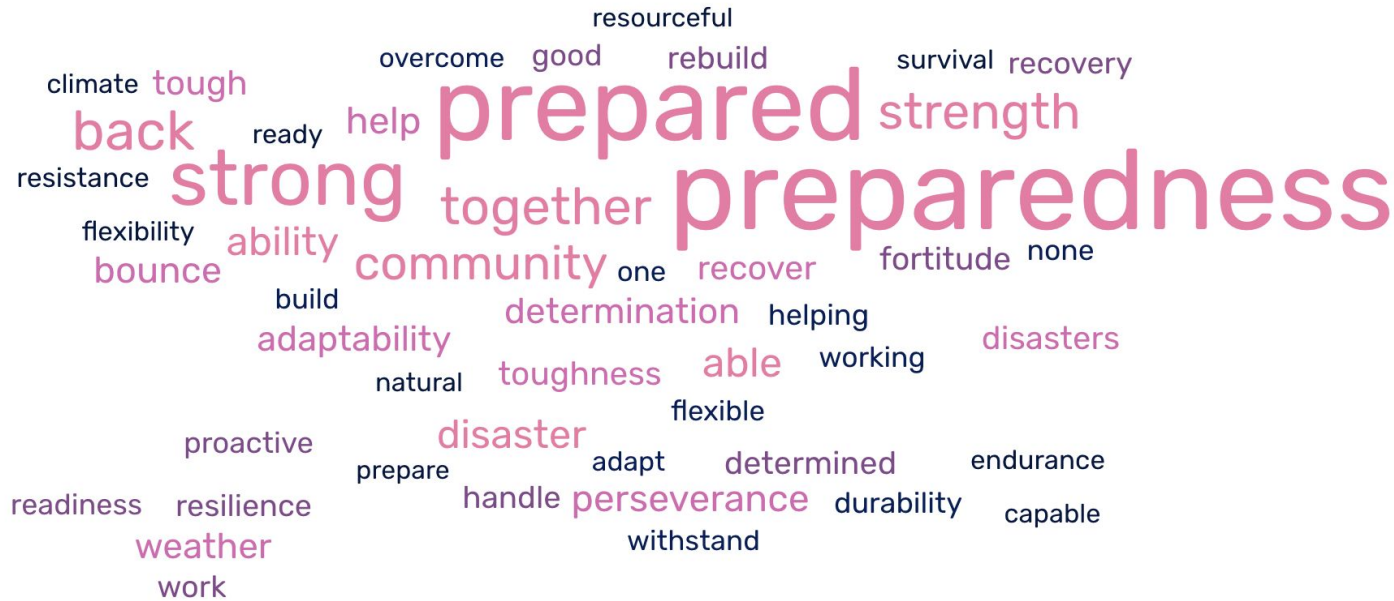


- Recovering stronger after a crisis or disaster

# What does resilience mean to you?

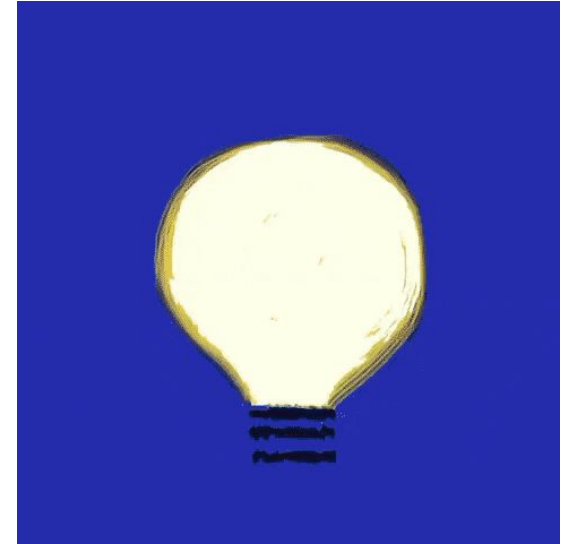


# How else would you use to describe a community's ability to handle disasters?



# Voters ❤️ natural climate solutions

- 86% of Democrats + 79% of Republicans support “**planting trees in cities** to provide shade, reduce heat + lower energy
- 89% of Democrats + 78% of Republicans support “**protecting grasslands** that support wildlife and improve water quality”

# Polling → Messaging

- Start with home, heart, health
  - Safe drinking water and sanitation
  - Disaster preparedness and prevention
- Describe specific projects and their benefit
  - Lead pipe replacement to keep kids healthy
  - Green streets that soak up rain
  - Coastal marshes that buffer cities against storms
- Localize and tailor to your audience
