
#### **Executive Summary**

- Climate/environment was as big of a factor in the midterms as any other issue area aside from abortion and the economy/inflation.
  - As expected, the economy/inflation and abortion were the two issue areas that midterm voters were most focused on
  - Voters were equally or more likely to name climate/environment as their single top issue than anything else after abortion and the economy/inflation
- Climate voters were critical to keeping the election competitive for Democrats.
  - o Roughly one in ten voters said that climate/environment was their top issue
  - Democrats won climate voters by a wider margin than they won any other issue constituency.
- The IRA was a political winner.
  - The midterm electorate much like the country on the whole was overwhelmingly supportive of the IRA


### As expected, inflation and abortion were the dominant issues in the midterms

# In polls that included climate/environment, only inflation, the economy, and abortion consistently ranked as more important







How serious a problem is climate change? (Network Exit Poll)



#### Most important issue facing the country




# Pre-election polling correctly predicted that climate and abortion would be key Democratic strengths

# The IRA ended up being a clear political winner in the midterms, with voters supporting it overwhelmingly


How much do you support or oppose the Inflation Reduction Act, which makes the largest investment ever in clean energy in an effort to reduce toxic air and carbon pollution?





Black and Latino voters were equally or more likely to say that the IRA was a "primary motivation" for them to vote this year as the Supreme Court abortion decision




#### Climate was not a focus of GOP attack ads
